
Milestone of 50 years has been crossed last year, this Malvika marks the inception of another great era, a new beginning that will span for a long time to come.


edge generation, acquisition and dissemination that will benefit society, and to educate and train people to work in fields





UNIVERSITY ANNUAL REPORT

- 1. The University successfully conducted the **selection of faculty** for Chemical Engineering Department and three faculty members joined the department.
- 2. Two **Academic council meetings** were held along with two finance committee, two Board of Management and one examination committee meetings.
- 3. Malaviya Utkristh Seva Samman would be given to staff members every year on 26th January.
- 4. 10 conferences/seminars/FDP were organised in this session.
- 5. Five students went to Ryukus University, Japan for summer internship.
- 6. In year 2018, 10% seats of B.Tech. 1st Year in Malaviyan Entrance Test (MET) were filled through JEE Mains merit list and counselling with HBTU Kanpur. Also 10% supernumerary seats (for outside the UP Domicile) of B.Tech. 1st Year were filled through JEE Mains merit list.
- 7. University bagged many sponsored and consultancy projects of India and abroad. Various MoUs were signed with Universities/Institutes of India and Abroad for students/academic exchange, etc.
- 8. One-week long induction program for the first year UG students (IPNS 2017-18) entering the university had been conducted during 1st May to 5th May, 2018.
- 9. The University started its PhD program in Chemical Engineering from the academic session 2018-19.
- 10. The University has started course in MSc Physics (specialization in Electronics) from academic year 2018-19 against 30 seats.
- 11. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor laid down the foundation stone for the installation of 11kV/0.4kV new substation and 11 kV underground cables from Khorabar substation to new substation of the University campus with a total cost of 490 Lacs and 250 Lacs respectively on April 04, 2018.
- 12. Introduction of MOTA i.e. Malaviya Outstanding Teachers Award (MOTA) to faculty on Teacher's day each year, based on their contribution in teaching, research and development, contribution in administrative work, social and commercial related activities etc.
- 13. Introduction of MESA: A Scheme to award 15 meritorious students with Malaviya Excellence Student Award (MESA) every year on the occasion of Independence Day Scheme.
- 14. Another scheme launched by University was **Tab 20-20** in which first 40 ranked candidates (20 boys and 20 girls) seeking admission in different courses of B.Tech. (I Year) through MET-2018 will be honored with a Tablet to each.
- 15. MMMUT Gorakhpur is ranked 6th among Emerging Engineering Institutions in the country by Times Engineering Survey 2018, Ranked 35th among top Government Engineering colleges and 16th in PG & Research by India today magazine.
- 16. MMMUT Gorakhpur is selected as mentor for Atal Tinkering Lab Program by MHRD, Government of India New Delhi.




YEARS OF BEING UNIVERSITY


The newly-built Takshashila and Pushpagiri Lecture hall complex with seminar halls in each department have added to the infrastructural grandeur of the college. Hostels such as

Imagine on one fine day you are sleeping in your house and suddenly few cops knock your door, arrest you for no reason and took you to a hospital for a forceful organ donation! Norman Cousins has rightly said that the eternal quest of the individual is to shatter his loneliness.

In the book 'The lonely city', it has been beautifully portrayed, "imagine standing by a window at night, on the sixth or seventeenth or forty-third floor of a building. The city reveals itself as a set of things, a hundred thousand windows, some darkened and some flooded with green or white or golden light. You can see them, but you can't reach them, and so this commonplace urban phenomenon, available in any city of the world on any night, conveys to even the most social a tremor of loneliness, its uneasy combination of separation and exposure."

You can be lonely anywhere, but there is a particular flavour to the loneliness that comes from living in a city, surrounded by millions of people. Cities can be lonely places, and in admitting this we see that loneliness doesn't necessarily require physical solitude, but rather an absence of connection, closeness, and kinship. An inability, for one reason or another, to find as much intimacy as is desired. Unhappy, as the dictionary has it, as a result of being without the companionship of others.

Loneliness is difficult to confess; difficult too to categorise. Like depression, a state which can run deep into the fabric of a person. What does it feel like to be lonely? It feels like being hungry: like being hungry when everyone around you is readying for a feast. It feels shameful and

over time these feelings radiate outwards, making the lonely person increasingly isolated, increasingly estranged. It hurts, in the way that feelings do, and it also has physical consequences that takeplace invisibly, inside the closed compartments of the body. It advances, cold as ice and clear as glass, enclosing and engulfing.

Loneliness might be taking you towards an otherwise unreachable experience of reality. So whether you want to remain a grieving lonely person or flourish as a solitude admiring individual is solely on you. Because loneliness expresses the pain of being alone whereas solitude expresses the glory of being alone.

I know and I get it that sometimes it might be difficult not to feel lonely and cut out, But therein lies an inescapable metaphor for life itself — we are, after all, subletting our very existence from a city and a society and a world that have been there for much longer than we have, already arranged in a way that might not be to our taste, that might not be how the building would be laid out and its interior designed, if we were to do it from scratch ourselves. MOBOCRACY -THE GROWING NORMAL

-Martin Luther King

As the serious threat of lynching casts a petrifying shadow over large portions of the country, the apex court has directed all the governments to take steps to prevent what it described as "horrendous acts of mobocracy". The court has asked the Parliament to consider passing a special law to stop the increasing cases of lynching. It is essential to protect the citizens, maintain faith in law and order of the country and to ensure that the "pluralistic social fabric" of the country holds against mob violence. A new law will work since there are gaps in the existing laws which is preventing the government to work fairly against lynch mobs.

The principle targets of the mob attacks are generally the people involved in cow-related lynching. According to verified reports, about 86% of the people killed in mob lynching cases are Muslims and 8% are the members of the scheduled castes. This not only creates communal disbalance in the country but also triggers verbal warfare between the political parties. The recent spate of the mob killings on rumours of child kidnapping mostly targeted strangers and mentally challenged persons.

Lynching is not officially a crime in India, but if the state administration chooses to suppress down the cases regarding mob lynching, then the Section 223(a) of the Indian Penal Code that is the code of

Criminal Procedure enables a group of people involved in a common and henious crime to be tried together.

While every unnatural death is a tragedy and one should be prevented from it, but the increasing cases of mobocracy not only depicts the loss of faith in the country's judicial system but also shows the anger and violent face of the human nature. Murder is murder, and the administration and the police should strictly deal with the a murderous crowd.

Social platforms are one of the main reasons for the spread of rumours that lead to mob lynching. Whatsapp India has limited the forwarding of message service to only 5 chats at once. In addition to this, to limit the viral messages, it has also removed the quick forward button next to the media button. More than 45 people have been killed in the past 5 months across the country after being accused of child kidnapping and other crimes in viral message circulated on Watsapp. The government in various states across the country have opted for internet shutdowns during crucial times like elections and examinations but in the time of net neutrality, internet shutdowns in a free society is not advisable.

The incompetence of the government along with the judicial system has lead to the increase in the number of shrouds. We together with the government should embark on a journey to put a red period on the rumours so as to decrease the shedding of colour red by the mobs on the road and savethe innocent people from the horrendous activities of the mob.

An Indian prisoner stares at the walls of his prison, which have not only narrowed down his physical space but also the spectrum of his thoughts. He looks at them in a hope that one day he will be free and see the world beyond the walls of the jail. But will he? It is a question that stays in his mind all the time, and the answer to which remains a mystery to him and his fate even. Because, there is a humongous number of Indian prisoners who are simply under trials, so in most of the cases it has not even been proved if the prisoner has convicted the crime he has been imprisoned for.

At the present time, Indian prisons face three disheartening problems: overcrowding, understaffing and underfunding. The publication, Prison Statistics India, brought out by the National Crime Records Bureau threw light on this issue by publishing that in 2015, there were close to 4.2 lakh inmates in 1,401 facilities, with an average occupancy of 114% in most. About 67% of total inmates were under trials, a poor reflection of Indian judiciary system.

In such a situation, the prison inmates are not getting even the basic human needs required for a minimal standard of living, let alone a dignified living.

There is definitely a dearth of ideas in justice administration. Public officials and social workers have agreed upon the need to remove the overcrowding but there is paucity of solutions as well as the fear of backlash against any move to decriminalise a bit of what is now considered a crime by our Constitution. Political willingness is necessary for Indian prison's reform but tackling the problems of prison and improving its conditions provides no political leverage. A political party will not gain votes by improving prison conditions and also not lose any votes by not improving prison conditions.

In such a condition can we hope for a better tomorrow for India's prisons, because "hope" is a good thing and no good thing ever dies, right?




ANNUAL TECHNO-MANAGEMENT FEST TECHSRIJAN



















TEAM SPEED WAGON CRUISER OF MMMUT SHINES IN





So to conclude I would say that it seems that all happened in a magic.



The 5th IEEE Uttar Pradesh Section International Conference UPCON 2018 on Electrical, Electronics and Computer Science Engineering is top level International Conference covering broad topics in the areas of Electrical, Computer and Electronics Engineering was jointly organised on 2-4 Nov, 2018 by Madan Mohan Malaviya University of Technology, Gorakhpur (UP),India and University of Ryukyus Okinawa, Japan.
