





Prof S. N. Singh obtained his M.Tech. and Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering from Indian Institute of Technology Kanpur, in 1989 and 1995. Presently, he is Vice-Chancellor, Madan Mohan Malaviya University of Technology Gorakhpur and leave from Professor (HAG), Department of Electrical Engineering, Indian Institute of Technology Kanpur, India. Before joining IIT Kanpur as Associate Professor, Dr Singh worked with UP State Electricity Board as Assistant Engineer from 1988 to 1996, with Rookree University (now IIT Rookree) as Assistant Professor from 1996 to 2000 and with Asian Institute of Technology, Bangkok, Thailand as Assistant Professor from 2001 to 2002. Dr Singh received several awards

including Young Engineer Award 2000 of Indian National Academy of Engineering (INAE), Khosla Research Award of IIT Roorkee, and Young Engineer Award of CBIP New Delhi (India), 1996. Prof Singh is receipt of Humboldt Fellowship of Germany (2005, 2007) and Otto-monsted Fellowship of Denmark (2009-10). Prof Singh became first Asian to receive 2013 IEEE Educational Activity Board Meritorious Achievement Award in Continuing Education. He is also recipients of INAE Outstanding Teacher Award 2016 and IEEE R10 region (Asia-Pacific) Outstanding Volunteer Award 2016. Prof Singh is awarded Prof GK Dubey Memorial Life-Time Achievement Award 2018 by IEEE UP Section, Looking at his academic and research contributions, IEEE USA has selected as IEEE Distinguish Lecturer in Power & Energy Society (PES) and Industrial Application Society (IAS) from year 2019.

His research interests include power system restructuring, FACTS, power system optimization & control, security analysis, wind power, etc. Prof Singh has published more than 450 papers in International/national journals/conferences and supervised 29 PhD (14 PhD under progress). He has also written two books one on Electric Power Generation, Transmission and Distribution and second is Basic Electrical Engineering, published by PHI, India. Information About The Courses

I. BACHELOR OF TECHNOLOGY (B.Tech.)

- (a) Admission Procedure: The admission at 90% seats of First year B.Tech. program will be through the Malaviya Entrance Test (MET) conducted by the University and remaining 10% through the merit list of JEE-Mains for UP Domicile Candidates. 10% of total intake of B.Tech. 1st year will be filled from outside U.P. candidates as supernumerary seats from the merit list of JEE-Mains.
 - Admissions in B.Tech.IInd year lateral entry for Diploma holders/B.Sc.will be through Malaviya Entrance Test (MET) conducted by the University against lapsed seats and 20% of intake of BTech 1st year.
- (b) Eligibility Criteria for Admission: The minimum eligibility for admission to the B.Tech. program shall be as per the University norms.

(c) Admission of N.R.I. / KM / Govt. Nominees/PMSSS

- Maximum 5% Seats of total intake are filled by N.R.I. candidates as per the State Govt. / University norms.
- ii) One seat for son/daughter of Kashmiri Migrants as per the norm of Govt. of India on supernumerary seats
- Admission to the Government of India nominee students is made as per the norms of Govt. of India. The intake for their admission is supernumerary.
- iv) Admission of candidates under the Prime Minister Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS) as per the order of AICTE on supernumerary seats.
- (d) Medical Standards: The candidate will have to submit Medical Certificate on prescribed format at the time of admission.
- (e) Fees and Other Details: Fees etc. as prescribed shall be realized in one installment each year, Students will be required to deposit the increased fees and user charges subject to revision by the University / Govt. from time to time. The details are also mentioned in the Brochure.

Note :-

- The students must deposit the University fees and dues in accordance with the notifications. It has
 no concern with the class or date of receipt of stipend etc.
- ii) The refund of the caution money shall have to be claimed back by students if they so desire. If it remains unclaimed for one year after passing out, it will be considered as lapsed and utilized for University development / work.
- iii) Based on the UGC guidelines for the refund of aggregate fees through the notification D.O. No. 1-3/2007(CPP-II) dated 6th December, 2016 and AICTE Public Notification in News papers PGRC/08(06)/2017, the University has finalized the following fee refund rules for the candidates admitting in session 2019-20 through MET-2019.

The admission process in the University is completely transparent and the seats are allotted on the basis of MET-2019/JEE (MAIN)-2019 ranks. The admission on the allotted seats can be confirmed by the candidates by depositing the university annual fee within the stipulated period of time decided by the University. The candidate depositing complete University fees within the stipulated period of time are considered to be registered against the respective seat. However, those candidates who do not deposit University fees their candidature will be cancelled, and his/her seat will be allotted to the next candidate in order of merit in the subsequent round(s) of counselling / upgradation.

III. MASTER OF TECHNOLOGY (M.Tech.)

(a) General: The University offers full time M.Tech. programs in Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Computer Science and Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering and Mechanical Engineering Departments. The duration of the program is 2 years of 4 semesters. The first two semester of program will be devoted for completing the course work and other requirements of the degree, while the third and fourth semester are devoted mainly for thesis work and the students will be required to submit a dissertation in partial fulfillment of the requirement for the award of master's degree as per prevailing Ordinance. - (c) Admission Procedure: Admission to M.Tech. program is made through Malaviya Entrance Test of the University from the candidates possessing prescribed eligibility qualifications.
- (b) Scholarship/Stipend:
 - A scholarship of Rs. 12400/- per month will be granted only to the candidates admitted on the basis of the "GATE" examination by MHRD, Govt. of India.
 - The continuation of scholarship will depend upon the satisfactory progress of the student as well as on submission of undertaking and acceptance of the conditions as specified by Govt. of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development (Department of Higher Education), New Delhi from time to time.
 - Students getting GATE scholarship are given academic work/teaching load of up to eight to ten hours/week.
 - Any scholarship holder leaving the course within the prescribed period of course shall be required to refund the amount of scholarship drawn by him/her.
 - If a student is directed to discontinue his/her studies by the authorities of the University for the reasons of gross negligence, irregular attendance, misconduct, using unfair means in the examination, involvement in RAGGING or any other act of indiscipline/mischief shall be liable to refund the entire amount of the scholarship /stipend.

IV. MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (M.C.A.)

- (a) General: A 3 three-year program of total 6 semesters leading to M.C.A degree is being offered from the session 1987-88. The admission is open to candidates of both sexes without discrimination of caste, creed and color. The minimum qualification required for admission to M.C.A. program is a recognized Bachelor's degree of minimum three years duration from any University of India as defined by UGC with mathematics at 10+2 level and obtained minimum 50% marks (45% in case of candidates belonging to SC/ST category) in the qualifying examination without grace.
- (b) Admission Policy: The admission to MCA first year is open to candidates under existing University rules through Malaviya Entrance Test conducted by the University.
- (c) Eligibility and Requirements for Admission: The minimum requirement for the admission to the 1st yr of the 3-year MCA course shall be as per the University norms.
- (d) Number of seats: The total intake is 75. The distribution of seats for the different categories is as per Govt./University norms.

X DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL ENGINEERING

The Department of Civil Engineering Department was established in 1962. It is one of the oldest departments of the University. I. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY RESOURCES CENTRE (ITRC)

Information Technology Resource Center (ITRC) was established in 2005 under world bank programme (TEQIP-I) and is unique of its kind among all state engineering universities/colleges of U.P. The objective of the center is to provide the central computing resources under one roof to students, faculty and staff with a vision to support and strengthen the teaching-learning process and research. The local area network spread in almost entire campus is being managed from this center. It remains open for 24 hours and is equipped with advanced computer networking hardware and software tools. Having around 300 computers arranged in its different labs, it provides uninterrupted high speed internet connectivity to the entire campus with two leased line connections- 1 Gbps (1:1) NKN and 155 Mbps (1:1) BSNL leased lines

Medical Clinic

The Outpatient/ General Medical Clinic are staffed by physician and nurses. Appointments may be made with a physician or nurse practitioner; walk-in patients are evaluated by nurses. Minor surgical procedures may be performed after evaluation by a physician. Proper dressing is performed afterwards. Serious medical conditions and emergencies are given priority in all cases. Emergencies may be referred to District Hospital or Medical College or any other area hospitals as warranted.

Women's Health

The Women's Health care is provided by all female staff including: a gynaecologist, and a registered nurse staff with training and experience in gynaecology.





Services

Treatment of women's health issues including routine gynecological examination, Pap smears, contraceptive services, emergency contraception, pregnancy testing and counselling, sexually transmitted disease testing and treatment, and routine gynaecological treatment.


TRAINING AND PLACEMENT CELL

Ordinances, Regulations and General Rules

The General Welfare of the students is looked after by the Dean / Dy. Dean of Students' Affairs, Chief Warden and Wardens of hostels and O.C., Day Scholars' Club.

I. REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

The Registration for courses is compulsory at the beginning of each semester. The details of date, time and venue of registration are announced in advance. It is compulsory that all the students present themselves at the registration desk on the specified date and time. In case of illness or emergent circumstances on the registration day, he/she must intimate the Dean / Dy. Dean Academics with documentary proof. The registration in absentia is not allowed.

II. CLEARANCE OF DUES

At the time of registration, a student must pay the fees and make other specified payments and complete necessary forms before he/she can be registered for courses formally. The student should obtain no-duescertificates before he/she can be registered for the courses of a semester – one from the Hostel Warden and the other from different sections of the University. These have to be produced at the time of registration. The no-dues-certificate is given by the warden when the student has no mess arrears in the previous semester and has paid the mess advance for the current semester. The second clearance is for University dues.

III. LATE REGISTRATION

No registration is allowed beyond the due date or the date with late fee, as announced by the University from time to time.

IV. RAILWAY CONCESSION

Railway concession orders are issued to the students from the office of the DSA if they apply for it with the purpose of going their home during vacation as decided by the University.

V. SCHOLARSHIPS/FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Scholarships are given to the students of S.C./S.T./O.B.C./General category as per the norms of the state government from time to time and for this the students have produce Current Income Certificate with Scholarship form at the time registration, else their cases may not be considered for their eligibility for the award of scholarship. Also, the students are given some financial assistance to participate in different academic/cultural programs/ activities both in and outside the University.

VI. IDENTITY CARD

In order to enjoy the status and the privilege of a bona fide University student, every student must obtain an identity card from the office of the Dean of Students' Affairs and keep it with his/her person, Identity card will be valid for entire duration of their course.

To obtain identity card 02 passport size photographs are required to be deposited in the office of DSA. The student will provide relevant information in the form and submit it to DSA office, Duplicate card, due to loss of original, shall be issued by the DSA after depositing a fee of 100/- in Accounts Section.

VII. RULES FOR PAYMENT TO THE UNIVERSITY

IX. ATTENDANCE RULES

- (i) Every candidate is required to attend all the lectures, tutorials, practical and other prescribed curricular and co-curricular activities. It may be relaxed up to 25% on medical grounds on specific approval, as per ordinance.
- (ii) 75% attendance is compulsory to appear in major examination. If the students satisfy the attendance criteria then only he/she will be permitted for semester examination.

X. DRESS UNIFORM ETC.

There is no University uniform; however, the students are advised not to wear loose dresses that may be unsafe for working near machines or uncomfortable for outdoor filed work. The following dresses are recommended for safety/other reason:

- Workshop and Field Survey: Khaki Shirt, Trousers and Black leather shoes.
- Games and Sports: White Shirts, White half pants White Socks and Canvas Shoes. On ceremonial occasions like Convocation, Annual Day, Annual Sports etc., the students are required to wear a formal dress.

- At the time of admission, the students will be declared hosteller/day scholar, keeping in view the
 availability of hostel facilities. The students so declared will deposit the fees accordingly.
- 5. The students will neither be permitted to reside in the hostel nor will be entitled to leave the hostel in the mid of the session. In special circumstance in between the session if any student is either allowed to reside in the hostel or allowed to be a day- scholar, the student is liable to pay the full hostel fees for the complete session. In no case hostel fees. Once deposited, will be refunded.
- In the beginning of a session, if a student opts to become a day scholar only, if his/her parents are residing in the city, then his/her hostel fee will be refunded.

Student Activities

I. TECH FESTIVAL AND SOCIETIES

An annual technical festival in the name of Tech Srijan, under the banner of IEEE and SAE-INDIA is organized every year and is open for participation for all technical institutes in the country

Each department has a society e.g. Association of Civil Engineers (ACE), Mechanical Engineering Society (MES), Electrical Engineering Society (EES), Computer Engineering Society (CES), Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECES), Managers 'Club. The University has the student's chapter of Institution of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE-INDIA), A Robotics Club has been opened in the University.

II. COUNCIL OF STUDENT ACTIVITIES (CSA)

Sports and Recreational Facilities: University has facilities for outdoor games, like Basketball, Cricket, Football, Hockey, Kabaddi, Volleyball etc. and indoor games, such as, Billiards, Badminton, Carom, Chess, Table tennis etc. Two grassy grounds—one for football and another for hockey are available. Another ground is also available for Cricket and Track & Field activities for students. Besides these, concrete courts are available for basketball, Skating and Tennis. Gymnasiums are also available separately for boys and girls equipped with modern facilities.

2. Research Cum Teaching Fellowship

The University provide Research cum Teaching Fellowship scheme to selected regular research scholars to promote research activity and create prospective teachers with Ph.D. qualification in the technical education by utilizing the experience of qualified faculty available in the University for stimulating and inspiring excellence in Technical Education and allied areas. The Fellowship consists of Rs. 25,000/- per month for three years duration and a contingency grant maximum upto Rs. 30,000.00 (Rupees Thirty Thousand Only) per annum for three years.

3. Incentive Prize

It has been proposed that thefirst 40 rank holders (20 boys and 20 girls) seeking admission to B.Tech. course at this university shall be provided with Tablets as incentive prize through Malaviya Entrance Examination 2019.

General Conduct and Discipline Rules

Each student shall conduct himself/herself in a manner befitting his/her association with an institute of national importance. He/she is expected not to indulge in any activity which is likely to bring down the prestige of the University. He/She should also show due respect and courtesy to the teachers, administrators, officers and employees of the University and good neighborly behavior to fellow students. Due attention and courtesy is to be paid to visitors of the University and residents of the campus.

The reputation of University depends solely on the performance of its students, not on building, equipments, structures etc. although they are the pre-requisite aids. The students of University are known not only by their performance in their academics but also by their conduct which is an integral part of their personality. In order to make the University feel proud of its students, the

following code of conduct is expected from the students.

- They should wear proper dress and project their image like dignified, respectable citizens of the country.
- The students are expected to develop a sense of belonging to the University, they must keep it upright and clean and create a congenial environment conducive for studies.
- They should read the notices regularly, so that not to miss any important information.
- Their action must reflect respect for the faculty members and must inculcate a spirit of fellow-feeling and mutual respect among themselves.

- Male/Female students must not pass undesirable remarks/comments on the female/male students, this will be considered as an offence.
- The students must not write on walls etc. or make undesirable sketches on the Walls/Furniture tops/doors etc.
- Drug is a health hazard. Students should not take drugs or consume any type of intoxicant.
- Ragging is a crime. The students should not indulge in any form of ragging otherwise they will be expelled from University and other action will be taken as per anti-ragging rules.
- In case of any dispute followed by fighting between/among or group clash (fighting/ Quarrelling in mass) the concerned students may by debarred from any or all papers of the semester examinations, up to 100% deduction of discipline marks and withdrawal of hostel facility as per severity of matter.
- Any type of misuse of internet facilities (face book), e-mail, mobile unwanted calls, SMS etc. will be considered as serious offence. In such cases, these shall be deduction of G.P. marks of imposing fine as decided by Proctorial Board or both.
- Proctorial Board shall be competent to impose a fine maximum up to taition fee of particular year and up to 100% deductions of discipline marks of that particular semester.
- Any dispute arising out of any reason in the University, the decision of the Vice Chancellor will final on all parties concerned.
 - 1. The following are deemed to be the acts of indiscipline:
 - Disregard of University/Hostel rules, orders and notices and tearing-off or tampering with the notices on the notice boards.
 - Disregard of orders and instructions of the faculty members, University staff.
 - iii) Noisy, boisterous, disorder and obnoxious behavior.
 - Misbehavior with any of the University staff and Ragging junior students.
 - Irregular attendance and unauthorized absence from classes and hostels.
 - Lack of punctuality in attendance, in payment of University dues and any other matter where dates, time for any duty, functioning or obligation are prescribed.
 - vii) Students found in possession of stolen properties, involvements in thefts, engaged in consumption of intoxicating drugs, liquor and other intoxicating drinks and such other activities as gambling
 - viii) Persistent negligence of students.
 - ix) Recourse to unfair means in test and examination

- x) Improper use of University property.
- xi) Taking part in strikes.
- xii) Failure to produce Identity Card on demand by a member of staff, warden etc. at any time and place.
- xiii) Failure to report the indiscipline cases to the Proctor/Warden etc.
- Watching porn-sites, pasting of notices on walls and pillars in the campus.
- xv) Unauthorized downloading/choking of Bandwidth on Internet.
- xvi) Passing filthy/lecherous remarks/eve-teasing of opposite sexes.
- Students, during training in industry, must conform to industrial discipline and follow factory rules in regard to attendance, holidays, dresses.
- Students shall be responsible for all books, apparatus, tools instruments and materials etc., issued to them.
- Students shall observers all safety precaution. The University is not responsible for accident of whatever nature in the University, hostel, workshop, laboratory and playground.
- No society, association or club shall be formed by the students, without prior permission of the University authority.
- No meeting shall be convened and no person shall be invited to address any meeting in the University premises without prior permission of the University authority.

A student who is found to have committed act of indiscipline is liable to anyone or more of the following punishments:

- Warnin
- ii) Censure
- iii) Fin
- iv) Reduction/Cancellation of Scholarship/ Stipend
- Recovery in part or full of losses or damages to the University Property or other caused by the delinquent students
- vi) Suspension from availing of anyone of University amenities and services or classes
- vii) Removal, rustication or expulsion from the University, Hostel or Mess
- viii) Withholding of character certificate
- ix) Deduction in G.P. marks
- x) Withholding of Offer/Appointment letters

Hostel Facility and Regulations

(a) General Information

The University is a residential institution with Eleven Hostels named Subhash Bhawan, Raman Bhawan, Tagore Bhawan, Ambedkar Bhawan, Tilak Bhawan, Vishweswaraya Bhawan and Ramanujan Bhawan (exclusively for first year boys), Sarojini Bhawan (for 1st year girls), Sarswati Bhawan, Kalpana Ghawla Bhawan and Kasturba Bhawan (for other year girls). These hostels accommodate a total of about 1450 students. The hostels are well furnished with necessary amenities available on the campus.

Students admitted to the University hostels are provided with the necessary furniture. The students will be personally responsible for upkeep of the articles issued to them by the warden in sound condition till the end of the session

First year students are provided with three/two-seater room as available. Senior students shall be provided with double and single seated rooms depending upon availability.

The hostels are under the direct supervision of the wardens who are teachers of the University and nominated by the Chief Warden/Vice-Chancellor.

The hostel messes are managed by the students themselves. They are required to deposit Rs. 12,000/- as mess advance at the starting of the session which will be adjusted in the mess bills at the end of the session every year in the Hostel. The mess secretary shall submit details of monthly accounts every month to the warden and report the dues, if any, in the same month to the concerned students as well as to the warden.

In case of any grievance or complaint, students may first contact their hostel caretaker and wardens who will solve the problems or report to appropriate authorizes. In case of any emergency, one may contact Chief Warden as well, but not in group/mass.

The presence of student on the last day and the first day before and after the block holidays and vacations is compulsory. Every student should request his/her guests to co-operate in observing certain formalities at the main gate of the university, such as entry, vehicle number etc.

Students are advised not to indulge in forgery of signature of authorizes, which is cognizable offence. Any such act will be reported to the police.

(a) Hostel Rules

- Preference is given for accommodation in the hostels to students from outside Gorakhpur city. Those who desire hostel accommodation must apply to the warden, Admission to a course does not automatically guarantee admission to the hostel.
- Students are expected to act in such a manner that an atmosphere conductive to effective study prevails in the hostel.
- Students are required to be aware of all notices that are put on the Notice Boards.
- The hostel wardens have full authority to check any room in the hostel at any time with or without help of police.
- Ragging is a cognizable offence, punishable under the law and is strictly banned. Any student involved in any kind of ragging will be liable for immediate expulsion from the hostel/university.

- 6. Possession of firearms, daggers, cycle chains, rode, iron rods or any other kind of weapons are strictly prohibited (Arms Acts.). Hostel inmates found in possession of the above will be handed over to the police or expelled from hostel immediately. No inquiry into the matter shall be required.
- No one is allowed to take part in any type of video film show in the hostel premises without the permission of the hostel warden.
- Unauthorized guests or outsiders in the hostel room are strictly prohibited. Any student keeping unauthorized person in his/her room will be liable to disciplinary action amounting to expulsion from the hostel. Guest may be allowed on prior written permission of the warden.
- No student shall occupy or interchange the room without permission and proper allotment of the room by hostel warden.
- Consumption of alcohol and other intoxicants and drugs are strictly prohibited. Anyone found consulting alcohol or drug will be expelled from the hostel immediately. No enquiry into the matter shall be required.
- Cooking food in the hostel room is strictly prohibited. In order to avoid fire hazards, no fire producing equipment in the rooms is permitted.
- 12. All complaints regarding thefts, repairs of furniture or electrical fitting etc. should be reported to the warden. Hostellers are warned not to keep valuable goods in their rooms. Hostel management shall not be responsible for loss valuable/belongings.
- Students shall have to abide by the decisions of the hostel wardens with respect to enforcement of the hostel rules failing which strict disciplinary action may be taken.
- 14. While leaving the rooms, it must be ensured by student that the light and fans are switched off failing which he/she will be liable to imposition of fines.
- Use of electrical appliances such as heaters, electrical irons etc. or a altering of electrical fitting in their rooms is strictly prohibited. Violation of this rules will lead to strict disciplinary action.
- Hostellers desiring to go out of station must obtain permission from the warden concerned before going out.
- Hostellers shall not remain outside the hostel during night between 10.00 p.m. to 5.00 a.m. Habit of coming in the hostel late from city or from anywhere (including other hostels) will not be appreciated.
- 18. During summer vacation or as soon as the final/annual exams are over all students excluding research scholars and other students who have their project work are required to vacate the rooms within two days failing which a sum of money imposed per day as decided by the University will be charged in addition to disciplinary action taken by the Proctorial Board.
- 19. Hostellers are supposed to hand over the rooms along with the furniture there and fixtures intact. Damage to hostel property such as doors, windows, electrical fitting, toilet fitting, glass panes etc. will lead to fine, disciplinary action, expulsion from the hostel. A general deduction from the hostel security deposit will be made at the end of the course, towards the breakage other than those which are charged against the individuals.
- 20. No permission shall be given to a student to stay in the hostel after his/her even semester examinations are over, and for the purpose of preparation or appearance in any entrance test or any competitive examination he/she must obtain permission from the warden. Violation of the above-mentioned hostel rules will lead to disciplinary action and expulsion from the hostel.
- 21. There will be a Hostel Management Committee consisting of Chief Warden as Chairman and Warden as Vice Chairman along with student's representatives from each wing and Wardens as the members. The Student representatives will look after the issues of maintenance and Discipline. A Separate group of student representatives shall constitute another subcommittee to look after the mess affairs under the supervision of the Wardens.
- 22. The boarders must keep their rooms neat and clean. They have to use waste paper baskets of their own in their rooms, Any waste material found in hostel lobby is likely to get cleaned by the residents of the lobby and a fine shall be realized from the residents in a combined manner as deemed fit by the hostel management.
- 23. Each boarder should check the fittings in his room at the time of occupation and takeover of the fitting and furniture in writing which are returnable on vacation of the room. Any loss or damage will be

- borne by the concerned boarder or boarders.
- Summer Hostel shall be available on payment basis as decided by the University from time to time.
- 25. Room furniture, electric fitting etc, are required to be maintained by the students in good conditions. At the time of allotment of seat / leaving the hostel for Summer Vacation every student must take over / handover the hostel room property and carefully. They shall not break or damage any furniture and fittings. If any breakage occurs then cost will be realized (individually or collectively), together with heavy fines imposed on them.
- Visitors are not permitted to stay in hostel after 8.00 p.m. and guests of students are not allowed to stay in hostel.
- Female visitors are not permitted at any time into the boy's hostels.
 Visitors may take prior reservation from university authority to stay in Institute Guest House / Visitors House on payment.
- 28. Boarders shall not leave the hostel without prior permission of the Warden; they shall apply to the Warden/Chief Warden stating reason of leaving and address of destination. Boarders who leave without application and permission shall be deemed to be missing and Police authorities/parents may be intimated as such.
- Boarders will be personally/collectively responsible for any loss or damage caused to the properties and equipment and other fitting in the common places, due to indiscipline.
- 30. University will not be responsible for acts of student which lead to the disturbance of public peace and tranquility or case of Law and Order in which they are knowledge or unknowingly involved, in or outside the university premises.
- 31. Students not on rolls are not eligible to stay in the hostels.
- Any boarder harboring any unauthorized element or anyone expelled/removed from hostel earlier or any outside element, will be punished which may be up to removal from Hostels/ University.
- Boarders shall treat their fellow boarders, University staff, hostel staff, mess staff with dignity and decorum.
- 34. Non-regular students having filled up form to appear at examination may be allowed to stay in the hostel temporarily subject to vacancy permitting, only if they obtain prior written permission of the authorities and undertake to abide by the hostel and deposit the fees of hostels in advance.
- 35. Students belonging to above categories willing to appear at their back-paper examinations may be allowed temporary accommodation in hostel not exceeding two months at a time, on payment of usual charges for food and accommodation to the hostel in advance, subject to satisfying other conditions.
- 36. No. hostel facilities shall be provided to Ex-Student.
- Students/Delegate from other organizations may be allowed temporary accommodation in hostel with permission from the Warden/ Chief Warden, for which they may have to pay usual temporary accommodation charges.
- No notice shall be put in the Hostel by any student directly unless such permission has been granted by the Warden of respective hostels.
- No student shall raise or assist others to raise any subscription in the Hostel on any account without prior permission of the authorities.
- No one should use the belongings of other students without their consent.
- 41. Employment of personal servant or attendant in a hostel is not allowed.
- Each student must carry identity card whenever he/she goes outside the hostel and produce on demand from institute/Hostel authorities otherwise a fine or disciplinary action might be taken.
- Disruption of electricity supply is beyond the responsibility of university authorities. Boarders should be equipped with flash light / lamps for their own sake.
- 44. Exhibition of video film is not permitted in Hostels.
- 45. Residents desirous of purchasing second hand bicycle, calculator, mobiles, computers etc. should ensure about the authenticity of the of the owner to avoid purchase of stolen and incriminating items.
- Boarders are not to patronized food / soft drinks / snacks from unhygienic shops and road-side vendors to avoid infection to themselves and spreading amongst fellow boarders.
- The boarders must be very particular about payment of hostel dues / university fees. The Accounts Sections shall accept the University fees only after production of up to date mess dues clearance from the hostel.

- 48. A student must remember that the hostel is the home of the students on the campus' he/she should behave himself/herself on the campus as well as outside in such manner as to bring credit to him/her and to the University.
- 49. A student once admitted in the hostel continues to be a hostel inmate throughout the year. He/She has to pay the room rent for the full academic session. The amount will be forfeited if the inmate decides to leave the hostel in the mid – session.
- Every student should stay in the accommodation allotted to him / her by the Warden concerned. He / she will not be allowed to change the accommodation once allotted.
- It is advisable for the students to use mosquito nets, since malaria is endemic here.
- 52. Clearness of the room is to be maintained by the student himself/herself with the help of the ward boy/lady, failing which the student is likely to be penalized by the authorities.
- 53. A student school not enter the rooms of others who are not in their rooms.
- A student shall not hand over the keys to his/her room to any other student/ person except the Warden or person authorized by him.
- 55. Ragging is a symbol of immaturely; it is strictly prohibited. To avoid such incidents, students of the first year are urged not to visit other hostels without their Warden's permission.
- 56. In all cases of violence or nuisance at public place inside or outside the campus, the University is not legally bound to defend any student or to take bail etc. If the necessary arises, the University authorizes may inform the guardian / parents of the students involved in such incidents. The responsibilities of defending the case will be entirely of the concerned student (s). Students shall be responsible for their action. No student shall be above the law. The hostel cannot be considered as a hiding place for miscreants. The police authorities have the right to enter the campus, detain or arrest anyone depending upon the severifoy of the offence. Parents are especially requested to guide their wards so that they don't indulge in any physical violence.
- Parents are requested to visit the University at least once in a year during stay of their wards.

b) Mess Rules

- Each Hostel has a Mess of its own, financed and managed by the boarders themselves through their representatives. The Wardens of Hostel mostly looked after the Mess Management whereas major issues are referred to the Hostel Management Committee/ Warden/Chief Warden for decision.
- Each student residing in a Hostel must join the mess attached to it. Individual cooking and messing outside is not permitted. All students as notified by the Warden from time to time shall observe mess rules.
- The cost of food including other overhead and establishment charges is to be borne by the boarders themselves. The University allows no subsidy.
- The students must observe the timings of the mess and visit the mess in proper dress.
- Proper care of the utensils and mess furniture while in use must be ensured, failing which the students are likely to be punished by the hostel management.
- Mess Dues/Advances should be paid in time by the dates in the respective hostel accounts as notified by the Hostel authorizes failing which the concerned boarder has to pay fines for the days of default, as imposed by the Warden of the Hostels.
- For payment of hostel dues, the boarders are required to open an account with S.B.I., M.M.M.U.T. branch, Gorakhpur and make all payments by transfer through bank vouchers. No payment in cash will be accepted.
- Boarders are to share responsibilities in running their messes and keeping their hostel clean and tidy.
- Other than the vacation, a boarder will be allowed to remain absent from th4e hostel only if he/she is granted leave of absence by the Dean, Academics/Vice Chancellor as per the university regulations. The information should reach the hostel Mess well in advance at least 24 hrs.
- 10. If the hostellers does not want to avail hostel mess facility for more than three days continuously on reasonable grounds on the

- recommendation of the warden, the student will be permitted not to pay mess for that period (provided the information is given in advance).
- 11. The students should dine together in the mess. Meals other than sick diets will not be served in the rooms of the borderers. Utensils/Chairs kept messes are not allowed be brought to the rooms of borderers.

d) Additional Instruction For Female Hostellers

a) Rules For Visitors

- At the time when students are accepted for admission in the hostel, the parents or guardians should submit a list of names and address of persons who may visit or be local guardians of their daughters or ward subject to approval by the Chief Warden/ Warden. If no names are received, the Warden/Chief Warden will exercise his/her discretion. Certified signature and photograph of local guardian should be given. Local guardian can be any close relation who has family.
- If the visit any person/persons has an adverse effect on the discipline of hostel in any way, the warden reserves the right to disallow such visitors.
- Visitors listed by the parents or guardians may meet the students as per visiting hours given below.

Visiting Hours: 5.30p.m.-7.00p.m. daily

- a) Approved visitors out of town and residents of campus may be allowed at the discretion of the warden.
- Male Student are not allowed to meet the girls in hostel unless in emergency for which they must obtain warden's written permission.

Rules for Going Outside the Campus

- Student will be permitted to go to city for marketing etc. only by the University vehicle trips arranged for them.
- No visit of any other type shall be permitted, except in the following condition:
 - i) Where the undertaking has been furnished by the parent/guardian.
 - ii) Where prior permission of warden has been obtained.
 - iii) Where the concerned student returns to hostel within time limit,
- Student will be allowed to go to their local guardian' place after having secured prior written permission from the warden on written request of local guardians and in such case, local guardian are responsible for taking the students and bringing them back to the hostel in time.
- Parent/guardians will be responsible for the welfare of the students from the time they leave the University campus on permitted leave, till the time they return to the hostel.
- Students may visit staff members or staff families staying in the campus only after taking permission from the warden.
- 6. No student will leave the hostel premises without permission from the warden of the person in charge. He/She must enter the time of leaving and his/her destination in the book provide for the purpose. Time of return must also be entered in the same book on his/her return, but this is not applicable to attend University.
- Girl students are not allowed to return to their hostels after 8.00 P.M. from Sunday to Friday and after 8.30 P.M. on Saturday, except under any unavoidable circum-stances that must be brought to the notice of the hostel warden.

e) Miscellaneous

- 1. Letters and messages must pass through the warden.
- Students desiring overnight accommodation or meal for an outstation guest must secure prior permission from the warden.
- Entry of girls in the boy's hostel is strictly prohibited. No resident student is allowed to stay with a lady in the hostel room. Violation of this rule may lead to disciplinary action/expulsion from the hostel.
- All invitations to various activities and functions, social visits etc. must be approved by the warden before acceptance by the students.
- Any student not abiding by the above rules and any other rules laid down from time to time by institute authorities will be subjected to disciplinary measures, If the offence is serious or repeated, he/she will be liable to suspension or expulsion from the University.
- Hostel premises can be inspected any time by Wardens/Vice-Chancellor. Hostellers are, therefore, advised to be properly dressed when coming out of their rooms, and keep their rooms neat and tidy.

GUIDELINES FOR SUMMER TERM

Each academic calendar will include odd & even semester along with a summer term (termed as Summer Term-20XX) for pursuing courses as per program from session 2017-18 onwards. For pursuing courses in summer term, it is mandatory to the students to get registered as per guidelines framed by university. However, this facility is available to all UG/PG students who had registered in the courses in the regular (odd & even) semesters and could not clear any of the subjects. PG including the PhD students can also register the thesis units during the summer terms.

Summer term shall be designed for 45 working days. For the lecture/lab courses, classes will be conducted on all working days as well as Sundays & holidays during summer term. There will be sufficient number of theory, tutorial and laboratory classes in summer term as prescribed in the Course syllabi of ordinance. For example; a subject having L-T-P as 3-1-2, will have at least 6-hrs lecture classes (it can be 1 hrs to 2 hrs) in a week with 4-hours practical classes. The process of evaluation will remain the same as followed in regular semesters, i.e. one mid-term and one major exam. Mid-term exam will be scheduled after 20-days of registration and major exams after 45 working days of semesters. The criteria for attendance will remain same as followed during regular semesters. For certain subjects of study in a Program, where the classes are not held, the process of evaluation will be through an end-term-examination. Students shall have to register during summer term on the advice of the respective Head of Department.

All students are required to register in each summer term for the subjects to be pursued by them as per the program, within a week after results of even semesters are declared. The sole responsibility for the registration in time for summer term will be of the student concerned only. In view of the short duration of the Summer Term, late registration shall not be permitted.

Registration Procedure: The Dean (UGSE/PGSRD) shall co-ordinate the registration process which will be assisted by the concerned Heads of Departments. The registration procedure shall involve:

- a) Filling of the registration form mentioning the courses to be credited in the summer term
- b) Payment of summer term fees and hostel/examination fees as fixed by the university

The students admitted to summer term shall have to fulfill all the requirements of registration after the results are declared (not later than one week) in consultation with their head of the departments. The students must deposit the registration form along with fees receipt to the office of Dean (UGSE/PGSRD) so that registration work finishes within one week of even semester results declarations.

Cancellation of Registration: Absence for a period of one or more weeks at a stretch in a subject during a summer term will not allow the student to appear in the minor/major exams of that subject.

Grade Calculation:

The grade points secured by the students in the summer term will be used in the computation of his/her CGPA. When a student repeats a course, the new grade will replace the earlier one in the calculation of the CGPA.

Other Relevant Information:

- The student applying for summer term classes shall have to pay Rs. 12000/- per subject before submitting registration form.
- Hostel Charges shall be Rs. 4000/- for summer term and mess charges will be paid as per their bill.
- 3. A student cannot registered for more than three subjects in a particular summer term.
- A department will offer any subject only when 5-students have applied for it. However, this provision may be relaxed by hon'ble vice chancellor for final year UG students.
